This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Designed and delivered by a specialist music teacher, Raynham's music curriculum follows the National Curriculum and Model Music guidance. We systematically develop skills in performing, listening, composing, and music history, aiming to inspire a lifelong love of music in every child.

Progression starts with singing in EYFS and expands to various instruments through KS1 and KS2. This includes integrated recorder, xylophone, and keyboard lessons, alongside whole-class Year 3 Ukulele tuition provided by Enfield Music Services. All lessons are differentiated for SEND and disabled pupils. On average, children receive an hour of music weekly as well as a weekly 30-minute singing assembly that reinforces classroom learning.

Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Children at Raynham have opportunities to join a number of different extracurricular clubs run by the music specialists and supporting staff.

- Choir
- Band
- Karaoke & dance

Rock Steady also provides in-school band lessons for children at Raynham. Parents regularly have the opportunity to watch their children perform. The school also informs parents regularly of any music opportunities offered by Enfield Music Services in the local area.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

At Raynham children have the opportunity to take part in musical events throughout the year. Christmas concerts, end of year celebrations are examples of opportunities for the whole school to sing together.

Through class assemblies each year group has the opportunity to perform and sing to parents throughout the school year. Additionally year 1 & 2 perform the Christmas nativity while year 6 perform an end of year musical.

The KS1 choir has had the opportunity to perform at the local singing festival run by Enfield music services.

In the future

Over the next few subsequent years we intend to:

- Look into funding streams to widen participation by Pupil Premium children

- Increase opportunities for children to perform across the borough and in London more widely.
